The IVF Board, consisting of two members appointed by the Upper Valley Career Center and three members of the Troy Rotary Club Board of Directors, is responsible for reviewing qualified applications.

Application Requirements

• Three letters of recommendation.

• The IVF Board may require the applicant to participate in a face-to-face interview during its regularly scheduled meetings. • A summary activity report will be expected to present programs on their project experiences to area service clubs, schools, and other interested groups.

Granting Policy

- Applications must provide for further Upper Miami Valley students and qualified students of other countries.
